Why Should Students Care?

The people in charge of the CSU (the Chancellor and Board of Trustees) have chosen a path that hurts students, faculty, and the future of public higher education in California. Faculty are working at multiple schools or leaving the system because the pay doesn't keep pace with the cost of living or comparable institutions. When faculty don't stay it affects what classes get offered, and overworked faculty don't have as much time for their students.

The Faculty Raise Wouldn't Hurt Students.

There is enough money in the CSU budget to pay our faculty the 5% increase **WITHOUT raising our fees**: is it a matter of priorities. However, the BOT may decide to increase our fees anyway. The faculty union (CFA) is fighting alongside us against the tuition increase that the BOT is considering. **If students and faculty stand together, we can ALL win.**
